2011-2012 IOWA TESTING



The Iowa Tests will be given K-11 during the week of March 12—16, 2012. Please mark those dates on your calendar as it would be helpful to have high attendance during that week to complete the battery of tests.

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As the weather begins to change, school cancellations and early dismissals can occur at anytime. If severe weather causes school to be cancelled prior to the start of the day, we will try to have information to the media by 6:30 a.m. In addition to our school website, the media outlets that will carry our announcements this year are: KMA, WOWT, KMTV and KETV.

If weather or unforeseen circumstances (loss of power or water) should occur during the school day and school is dismissed early, <u>PLEASE HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE WITH YOUR CHILD</u>. When early dismissals occur during the day, we usually have limited time to get information out and many parents aren't aware that an early out has taken place. Also, we have over 750 students in the district and only a couple of phone lines in each building. Don't assume that your child will be able to call you if a decision is made to dismiss school during the regular day. Have a plan in place! The elementary has forms for each parent to keep updated outlining your family's specific plan to deal with this type of situation. Parents of middle school and high school students need to discuss with their child what plan of action they will take in the event of an early dismissal during the school day. Proper planning now will provide assurance to you and your child that all will be okay should we ever have an unforeseen early dismissal.

CAUTION: Changes in weather arriving soon

<u>COMING SOON</u>: A new Parent Notification system has been purchased to allow Treynor school officials to communicate school cancellations, early dismissals, emergency information, activity schedule changes and general notices or announcements to parents in a timely and efficient manner. The vendor is currently working to get the new system up and running. Once the new system is active, parents will have the ability to sign up and select multiple methods for receiving notifications from the school (direct phone calls with recorded voice messages, text messages, emails, text-to-speech, TTY, Facebook, Twitter, and RSS). Be watching the website for updates regarding this new and exciting service.

Dear 6th – 8th Grade Middle School Parents,

The Treynor Middle School Bank will open for business on Wednesday, November 9th. Every Wednesday during the lunch period students can make deposits into a savings account.

What does this mean to you and your student? She/he will now be able to participate in a unique savings program designed to teach students to be long term savers. Students who have existing TS Bank accounts or choose to open one will have their deposits credited to their individual account. Those who do not bank with TS Bank are also encouraged to participate as all money deposited will be maintained under a non-interest bearing Treynor Middle School account and information about each student's deposits will be maintained separately.

As this is a savings program withdrawals are not available at school. Any deposit amounts \$1 and higher will be accepted. When your student completes 8th grade you may choose to continue to participate in an individualized savings program or receive a check for the balance in your student's account.

As previously stated the bank will be open each Wednesday to accept student deposits. Each student will have their own savings ledger to record their deposits. Prizes are awarded to each student as they reach savings thresholds up to \$1,000. TS Bank account holders will also receive market rate interest on their accounts.

The goal of this program is to provide our students the opportunities to not only learn about savings and how banks operate, but to also become savers themselves. We are building a community of economists here at Treynor Middle School and want your child to become a savvy saver.

Financial Aid Meeting for Seniors and Parents: Tuesday, Nov. 22

The annual Financial Aid Meeting for seniors and their parents will be sponsored by THS on **Tuesday, November 22**, **2011 at 7:00 p.m.** Any senior who is considering post-high school education should attend no matter whether it would be a four year college, two year college, or one year technical school. Essential information on the financial aid process will be presented. The meeting will last about one hour. Packets of information will be distributed.

The Iowa College Access Network (ICAN formerly the College Planning Center) from Des Moines will be making a presentation covering the topics:

- > Completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- Electronic processing
- Deadlines
- > Overview of the financial aid process
- > Types of financial assistance available
- Scholarships and scams
- > Helpful tips
- Places to go for help

What Needs to Get Done for College Now?

The fall is a busy time for seniors to get a lot of important things done for college planning. Here are some of the things that need to get accomplished in the fall:

- 1. **Complete and send college applications**. Applying does not commit a student to a college. It simply means that the student is interested and is seeking admission. Admission opens a communication line between the college and the student.
- 2. **Campus visits.** It is essential to get campus visits done before the December. In December the weather can turn cold and snowy, and college campuses begin to shut down for the end of the semester. Students involved in activities and athletics may want to plan around those activities before the schedule gets busy.
- 3. Attend the Financial Aid Meeting at THS on Tuesday, Nov. 22, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. It is a very important meeting to help students and families learn about the financial aid process.
- 4. **Register for a PIN** (Personal Identification Number) to electronically sign the FAFSA in January or February. Both a senior student and one parent should register for a PIN. Go to: <u>www.pin.ed.gov</u>.
- 5. **Organize for scholarship applications.** Students should write a resume that will list the activities that have been involved in the school and community, awards that they have won or achieved, community service activities that they have been involved. Assembling all of this information will make scholarship applications much easier.

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- If a student is admitted to a college, be ready to pay a housing deposit or enrollment (if needed) and look for scholarship information through the college as well as general scholarship searches: <u>www.fastweb.com</u>; <u>www.finaid.com</u>; scholarship search through <u>www.ihaveaplaniowa.gov</u>.
