#### 2014-15 School Calendar ....

The school calendar for next year is in draft form at this time. A copy of the draft has been shared with the Board of Education and can be viewed on the school website under the "calendar" tab. Faculty and staff are currently in the process of reviewing and providing input pertaining to the draft. Once a final proposal has been created, the proposed 2014-15 school calendar will be reviewed by the Board of Education at their March meeting. If approved, the 2014-15 school calendar will be available on the school website by mid-March.

As the weeks of winter begin to wind down, I'm happy to report that we have only used two snow days thus far.—Unfortunately, we have had six additional days disrupted by late starts or early dismissals due to weather.

The school calendar includes four days built in for weather, state tournament days, etc. At this point in time, we are still scheduled to dismiss school on May 23. In addition, we can still accommodate two more cancellations before we have to start adding make up days to the calendar. However, if we don't end up using all four snow days built into the school calendar, school could be dismissed prior to May 23.

# CAUTION: Changes in weather arriving soon...

As the weather begins to change, school cancellations and early dismissals can occur at anytime. If severe weather causes school to be cancelled prior to the start of the day, we will try to have information to the media by 6:30 a.m. In addition to our school website, the media outlets that will carry our announcements this year are: KMA, WOWT, KMTV and KETV.



If weather or unforeseen circumstances (loss of power or water) should occur during the day and school is dismissed early, PLEASE HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE WITH

YOUR CHILD. When early dismissals occur during the day, we usually have limited time to get information out and many parents aren't aware that an early out has taken place. Also, we have over 750 students in the district and only a couple of phone lines in each building. Don't assume that your child will be able to call you if a decision is made to dismiss school during the regular day. Have a plan in place! The elementary has forms for each parent to keep updated outlining your family's specific plan to deal with this type of situation. Parents of middle school and high school students need to discuss with their child what plan of action they will take in the event of all early dismissal during the school day. Proper planning now will provide assurance to you and your child that all will be okay should we ever have an unforeseen early dismissal.

A new Parent Notification system has been purchased to allow Treynor school officials to communicate school cancellations, early dismissals, emergency information, activity schedule changes and general notices or announcements to parents in a timely and efficient manner. Parents have the ability to sign up and select multiple methods for receiving notifications from the school (direct phone calls with recorded voice messages, text messages, emails, text-to-speech, TTY, Facebook, Twitter and RSS). ## OPEN ENROLLMENT DEADLINE

Parents/guardians considering the use of the open enrollment option to enroll their child/children in another public school district in the state of lowa should be aware of the following dates:

**March 1, 2014:** the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2014-2015 school year, except for "good cause" reasons or kindergarten applications.

Kindergarten applications must be filed on or before September 1 of the school year in which open enrollment is requested. (September 1, 2014 for the 2014-2015 school year).

In a few short weeks, we will be taking our annual spring tests. Starting on Monday, March 31, our middle school students will be taking the Iowa Assessments. The students will test at the beginning of each day that week. The results have been used several ways, including the following:

- Helps the school determine any subject areas or concepts that may need more teaching emphasis.
- Scores for schools throughout lowa are posted on the Department of Education's website and families moving into the area compare school's test scores when deciding which school to enroll their children.
- A student's individual scores help determine if he/she is making appropriate academic progress or may need additional academic support.
- Taking the tests prepares students to take other standardized tests, including college entrance exams such as the ACT.
- Test results help determine if the school has met Annual Yearly Progress goals set by the state.

Please try to make sure that your child is getting plenty of rest and eating a nutritious breakfast before heading off to school each day so they are at their best for testing.

On a different note, if you have not had a chance yet to sign up for Treynor Community School District's Official social media sites, you may want to do so when you get a chance. This is one more way we are trying to keep our community informed on what is happening in the district, both inside and outside of the classrooms.

Students are gearing up for scheduling classes for the next school year, spring sports season is underway and the senior class is ready to graduate, which I think hit them at the beginning of the school year. Within the high school, we still have a lot to do, starting with taking the lowa Assessments. On Monday, March 31 through Friday, April 4, grades 9-11 will be racking their brains to show off their superior knowledge on these tests. The results from the lowa Assessments will be used in several ways, including:



- Help determine subject areas or concepts that may need more teaching emphasis.
- Help determine if individual academic progress is being made, or if additional support is needed for an individual.
- Help prepare students to take other standardized tests, including college entrance exams, such as the ACT or SAT.
- Help determine if the school has met their Annual Yearly Progress goals set by the state of Iowa.
- Help attract families to Treynor High School. The lowa Department of Education posts scores from every school on their website, and families moving into the area compare schools' test scores when deciding in which school to enroll their children.

Other items to complete includes CPR training for seniors. All students are required to have taken CPR training before they can graduate, according to state regulations pertaining to the "Healthy Kids Act". Your child will need to pay \$5.00 if they would like to receive a certification card after successfully completing their training. The training will be Tuesday, April 1. Spring semester parent-teacher conferences will be held on Tuesday, March 18 and Thursday, March 20 from 4:00—8:00 p.m. Teachers will be in their rooms eagerly waiting your arrival.



# Cardinal Financial Literacy Update

#### PRE-PLANNING MAKES GOOD FINANCIAL SENSE



Many families can be so busy with day-to-day challenges - running kids to practice, juggling work-related requests, power-shopping for groceries and figuring out what to eat for dinner - it's easy to put off important discussions about investments, family finances and estate planning. Because it's not unusual for just one spouse to manage the family's bills and assets, it can leave the other spouse or family totally unprepared if disability, divorce or death were to take place.

That's why it's important for partners, and older children, to have at least a basic understanding of the family's finances. Here are some simple steps you can take to help prepare your family and avoid future complications:

#### Start by identifying your compensation and benefits package

While it may seem obvious, make certain you document how much each wage-earner is paid and whether or not that compensation includes stock options or other deferred compensation, such as a bonus or commissions. Also document your participation in your employer's 401(k) or other savings program, and whether or not your benefits package includes life insurance or other supplemental insurance benefits such as long-term care or critical illness. At the same time, look to see how much of your individual compensation is contributing to pay monthly expenses and support long-term investments. This can give you a loose idea as to future life-insurance or disability insurance needs should one of you not be able to earn an income.

#### Create a list of your assets

Identify all of your financial accounts, including retirement accounts and any brokerage, checking and/or savings accounts. List where the accounts are held, whose name is on which account, and how to access the account online.

This is also a good time to consider adding additional names to these accounts so other family members can have access should something happen to you.

Add your insurance policies to this list and clearly note where they are held, whether or not the premiums have been paid, and give the name and contact information of the insurance agent. If its been a while, take time to review your beneficiaries. Are they the same for each account? Has your family situation changed over the years that would make you want to change your beneficiaries?

Next, list any major assets, such as your house, car, boat, or significant art, furniture or jewelry (perhaps a family heirloom has been passed down through multiple generations). Be sure to include things like vacation timeshares, rental property, airline or hotel points, and special collections.

#### Don't forget your estate documents

In addition to your assets, identify the location of your will, trust, living will, powers of attorney, and documents that spell out guardianship designation for minor children. These documents, combined with the other information, are instrumental in developing a comprehensive estate plan.

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# FINANCIAL LITERACY CONT'D.

#### Talk with your spouse

Once your list is complete, have a candid conversation with your spouse about your assets. Together, agree how you would like to manage those assets for the long-term. Then make copies of your list. Put one copy in a safe place - such as a safety deposit box - and give a copy to either your financial advisor, the lawyer who drafted your will, or to a trusted family member or friend.

#### Talk with your children

Although grade school-aged children will likely be too young to understand the importance of what you are documenting, you should have a conversation with your teenagers or young adult beneficiaries. Help them understand that it's always important to plan ahead for emergencies. Explain that - although you don't anticipate adversity - you are taking measures now to ensure that your family will be prepared if the situation arises.

#### After the FAFSA is done, now what?

(Reprint from March, 2013 CCC)

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the big item to get done in February for high school seniors to prepare for college. But now the question is what happens from here?

- The Department of Education will process the application either by paper or electronically.
   The student will then receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). It can come electronically by email or in paper form. It is a chance to check numbers that were entered to see if any important changes need to be done. The changes can be submitted either on-line or by paper.
- Some colleges will contact students asking for verification of their FAFSA numbers. Some
  colleges like the University of Iowa ask for verification for all students. Some randomly select
  students for verification. Simply follow the directions in the letter instructing you on the
  verification process and provide the necessary documentation.
- 3. If something occurs as a major event after the FAFSA is completed which will greatly affect the family income (loss of a job, extended illness, etc.), contact the college financial aid office. They are able to do a professional judgment and possibly adjust the student's financial aid package to be more in line with the family financial situation. The college financial aid office will need some type of documentation to verify the situation.
- Look for scholarships. Scholarship information is posted on the Scholarship Central web page of the THS web site.
- All colleges in which the student has been accepted and had FAFSA results sent will respond with a financial aid package to the student in March to April. The package will list the costs of attendance, and then there will be a listing of the financial aid the student is awarded in the form of grants, scholarships, work study, and loans. The college will have a line on the form for the student to accept each line of financial aid. The student then is to sign the letter and send it back to the college financial aid office. Two important points to be made: 1) The student is not required to accept all the financial aid listed on the letter. Obviously grants and scholarships should be accepted. But a student is not required to accept all loans and work study. That part of the package can be rejected, but the student should have a plan as to how they are going to finance that part of the package. 2) Even if a student signs the financial aid letter and sends it in, that does not commit you to that college. If you decide to attend that college, then the signed financial aid package will be binding. Any college that sends a financial aid package that you decide not to attend, you should notify the college that you will not be attending.
- If the student is taking out student loans, the college will be sending information on the loans including a promissory note to administrate the loan.
- Make sure to compare your financial aid packages from the various schools that send them
  to you. You may find that a higher priced college may come through with more financial aid
  than a lower priced college.

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#### Freshman Orientation for 8th Graders

On March 31, 2014 at 7:00 p.m., Treynor High School will be presenting an orientation meeting for 8th grade students and their parents who will be freshmen for the 2014-15 school year. Topics to be covered will be: graduation requirements, designing a four-year plan of courses, post-secondary education options, NCAA academic requirements for athletes, and scheduling information. This meeting will inform parents and students about the academic course work required to graduate from THS and also to be prepared for college. All current eighth graders and their parents are invited to attend. The meeting will be in the auditorium and will last about one hour.

#### Seniors: Check Scholarship Central

It is the one-stop page for scholarship information at THS. New information is updated weekly. Helpful scholarship links are also provided.

#### Treynor Local Scholarship Application Deadline: March 17

Seniors applying for local scholarships based in Treynor must have their applications completed and handed in to the counseling office by March 17, 2014.

#### Iowa Assessments - Week of March 31 to April 4

During the week of March 31 to April 4, students in the Treynor Community Schools will be involved in achievement testing utilizing the lowa Assessments. In the past this corresponding testing was called the lowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS) and the lowa Tests of Educational Development (ITED). The tests have now been reorganized and are called the lowa Assessments.

The purpose of the testing is to assess the growth of Treynor students in their academic skills. The tests serve as an important resource for teachers to evaluate the abilities of their students and to satisfy state educational requirements toward school improvement and No Child Left Behind on the federal level. Parental support of testing in emphasizing good effort on the part of their students would be much appreciated so that valid results can be obtained. It is also important to eliminate absences as much as possible to reduce the time that has to be devoted to make-up testing. Seniors will have special programming that week and are expected to attend at 8:30 each day.

#### ACT Test Dates 2013-14

Students may register on-line at <a href="www.actstudent.org">www.actstudent.org</a> or pick up a registration packet from Mr. Irvin. Remember the ACT Writing Assessment is optional and students should check with their prospective college to see if the ACT Writing Assessment is required for admission. This applies to the class of 2010 and beyond. Students can also check the ACT Website (<a href="www.act.org">www.act.org</a>) for colleges that require the writing assessment for admission.

#### State of Iowa Grants and Scholarships

#### FAFSA and the Iowa Financial Aid Application

Although applying for state financial aid requires effort on your part, it has never been easier. By completing the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u>, you will apply for most federal, state, and institutional scholarships, grants, and work study programs. Some state grant programs require a separate application which you can complete through the Eligibility Wizard in I Have a Plan Iowa (<a href="www.ihaveaplaniowa.gov">www.ihaveaplaniowa.gov</a>). This single application will allow you to apply for multiple state programs. Please be aware of the <a href="individual application deadlines">individual application deadlines</a> surrounding the state scholarship and grant programs.

Step 1: Complete the <u>FAFSA</u> after January 1, 2014, for funding in academic year 2014-15. The FAFSA must be filed on or before July 1, 2014, to be considered for most state financial aid programs in lowa.

Step 2: Complete the Iowa Financial Aid Application after January 1, 2014, for scholarship and grant funding in academic year 2014-15. Apply as soon after January 1 as possible, as the scholarship and grant programs have priority filing deadlines.
