Snow Day/Make-Up Day Plans.....

As we enter the final quarter of the school year, it's time to try and forecast the last day of school for this year. Thus far, we have had seven school days disrupted by late starts or early dismissals due to weather. We are not required to make up this time. However, we have missed five full days of school due to snow days and state tournament days. These days are required to be made up. Fortunately, we have four days built into the current calendar for such situations. Therefore, at this time, we only have one day of school to make up, pending any additional weather issues.

The tentative plan is as follows...

- If we have any additional snow days prior to mid-April, all make up days will be held after Memorial Day (May 27, 28, 29, etc....).
- If we make it to mid-April and it appears that we will just have the one day of school to make up, we will consider shortening Easter Break and making up that one day on Monday, April 21. This would allow for school to still dismiss on May 23, prior to Memorial Day.

Keep your fingers crossed for good weather! A notice will be sent out mid-April with the final plan.

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"District Details"...a few notes from Superintendent Elwood

Treynor Community Schools Property Tax Rate to Decrease by \$.41

The Treynor Community School's Board of Education reviewed the projected 2014-15 school budget at their March meeting. The levy rate paid during the 2013-14 school year is \$14.57. The new rate for 2014-15 is projected to decline to \$14.16. Therefore, the school's portion of your property taxes will be reduced by .41 cents.

This will be the fourth year in a row the school district has been able to reduce their property tax rate. The rate has fallen from \$15.89 to \$14.16.....a total decrease of \$1.77.

Strategic Plan Review & Input.....

A copy of the Treynor Community School District Plan can be found on the school's website (www.treynorschools.org) by clicking on the "District" tab and then the tab labeled "Strategic Plan". This plan is used by the Board of Education to help identify projects, positions, and programs that the District may need to address in the next few years. When the Board of Education looks at allocating resources for various projects, the Strategic Plan is used as part of the process.

Please take some time to review the plan and offer any suggestions of items the Board may want to include. Suggestions and ideas can be emailed to Mr. Elwood at kelwood@treynorcardinals.org.

The Strategic Plan gets reviewed annually; however, every 4-5 years, as many of the tasks are accomplished, we go back and complete an in-depth review. Throughout the month of April, we are soliciting input from parents, students and community members. We started the in-depth review process in February at a Board work session. During March, the faculty and staff were given an opportunity to review the plan and provide input.

The new ideas/items generated thus far are listed in blue text on the Strategic Plan. The items included in the plan are usually larger purchases that take a significant amount of revenue to accomplish. Minor projects (like painting a room or fixing one computer) can be dealt with in the annual budget and are typically not listed in the plan. Also, don't get hung up on whether an item is categorized as a 1-2 year goal, 3-5 year goal, or 5+ year goal as the list will be re-prioritized once it has been updated.

Please remember that this plan is intended to be a document that is continually changing. Goals will be accomplished, new items will arise that will be added to the plan, and time frames for goals will shift as the district's needs and resources continue to change.

Thanks for taking time to participate in the review process. Your input is much appreciated! As always, thanks for your continued support of our students, staff and programs.

"Parents Still Make a Difference" has a few suggestions for parents in regard to this. They are as follows:

- 1) Ask questions about assignments. Which one was the most interesting? Which one was the most difficult? What are you studying now in History? Do you have any projects or tests coming up? Convey to your child that you are still very much interested and want them to continue focusing on school work.
- If your teen averaged three hours of homework per night during the winter, a new 15 minute homework average should make you suspicious. A comment like, "Your teacher sure let up on the homework suddenly", might be enough to fix the problem.
- Suggest that your teen do the reading aspect of homework on the front steps. That way they are still able to enjoy the sun without sacrificing homework time.

LAKIN OUTSTANDING TEACHER AWARD

For the past six years, KMA and the Green Hills Area Education Agency have presented the Charles E. Lakin Outstanding Teacher Award. Two instructors within a 40-mile radius of Emerson—Lakin's hometown—receive the award each year for efforts in enticing students to come to school each day.



With this spring's process, the Lakins will have awarded \$180,000 to area teachers and their associated school districts over the past six years.

Winners will be announced in May—no announcements will be made prior to the actual presentation (teachers who are nominated will not be informed of their nomination).

There are four awards given annually—two for elementary schools and two for secondary schools. The winners will receive \$12,500 each. The teacher receives \$10,000 and the school \$2,500 (one for elementary schools and one for secondary schools). The honorable mention winners will receive \$2,500 each (one for elementary schools and one for secondary schools).

Eligibility criteria includes certified, full-time teachers or counselors (does not include administrators) currently employed in accredited lowa schools with a minimum of three years continuous teaching experience in the same school.

The judges include an anonymous panel from the immediate area of the award. None are current school employees or board of education members. The Lakin family will not be involved in the judging process.

Nominations will be accepted through March 31st and can be made at http://www.kmaland.com/lakin.asp. Awards will be announced in May. This is a great opportunity to reward deserving teachers and the continued funding of this award depends on the interest in each of the local communities.

Understanding College Financial Award Letters

Tips for Comparing Financial Aid Packages (Courtesy of the Iowa College Access Network)

After weeks of waiting, it's finally time for college-bound students to see what financial aid colleges will offer and to make some decisions on where to go. As mail arrives, students will eagerly open it up and ... blink in confusion.

Award letters come in many different formats, and financial aid packages are made up of different types of aid that don't necessarily match up from school to school. Students and parents often have a hard time determining which school is offering the best financial aid package for them.

Experts at the lowa College Access Network® (ICAN) regularly help students straighten out the confusion without recommending any particular school, said Juan Garcia, executive director. "If you need help, please call or stop in at one of our College Planning Centers," Garcia said. "We can help you compare different packages so you're making an informed decision."

In addition, ICAN offers this information about financial aid award letters.

How Packages Are Created

Each school you apply to considers several factors when creating your financial aid package.

- Submitted financial information. The information you provided on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) creates an overall picture of your and your family's ability to pay for your education. This is known as the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and depends on income, savings, number of family members in or soon to attend college, and other factors.
- Outside aid. If you've been awarded scholarships or grants from organizations outside the school and government, those will likely reduce the amount of aid offered.

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- Available funding. Every school and the federal government have a limited amount of money to hand out to students. Depending on availability of funds and qualifications for grants, scholarships and federal student loans, you may qualify for different types and amounts of aid at different schools.
- Your interests and abilities. Your field of interest, the major you declare, and your participation in athletics, arts and other activities may qualify you for more scholarships specific to those areas. The availability and amount will vary from school to school.

Types of Aid

With all the variables, it's important that you pay close attention to the types of aid offered rather than just the bottom line.

- Gift aid. Scholarships and grants do not need to be paid back, so these carry
 more weight than other types of aid. Generally, the more in gift aid a school
 offers, the better the financial aid package, but check to see if the awards are for
 only a year, if opportunities are available for future years, what you need to do
 to re-qualify for or keep the awards, and what percentage of the total cost they
 make up.
- Work-study. A work-study position provides some benefits over other part-time
 jobs; it may be closely aligned to your declared major and offer more scheduling
 flexibility, for example. This is a type of self-help aid, but because the money you
 earn is yours to spend on college costs without repayment, it's better than loans.
- Federal student loans. Federal student loans, another type of self-help aid, often offer better rates and terms than private student loans, so they're definitely worth considering. Be sure you understand the repayment requirements and think seriously about whether you'll be able to make payments with your anticipated starting salary after school. Different types of federal student loans also offer different terms, so weigh the pros and cons of each type when comparing.

Comparing Aid and Packages

Now that you know about the different types of aid, consider how each financial aid package affects the overall cost of attending that school, and then compare across schools.

- Consider all costs. Some award letters provide only the direct costs of tuition
 and room and board, while others include estimated amounts for transportation,
 books and supplies, required fees, and other indirect costs. Make sure you plan
 for all expenses, whether they're listed in the letter or not, as you weigh your
 options.
- Compare gift aid to self-help aid. A higher percentage of gift aid (like scholarships) than self-help aid (like loans) probably means you'll graduate with less debt to repay from that particular school. As you compare different schools, also think about what percentage of the overall cost is picked up by gift aid.
- Keep timelines in mind. Your award letters likely show awards for the upcoming school year. Find out whether the awards are renewable for additional years, and think about how long you'll need to attend that school. If you'll have trouble getting into the classes you need for graduation at some schools, you may need to plan for more than four years at those institutions.
- Know what the school offers. You may be willing to pay more or take on a
 little more debt to graduate from a particular school because of its reputation, its
 ability to help you find a job in your career choice or other reasons. On the other

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hand, a good financial aid package may open new possibilities at a school that was previously lower on your list.

What to Do Next

After you've considered the offered financial aid packages, take these steps.

- Follow directions. Read each letter to see what you need to do to accept or decline the package. Even if you haven't decided which school to attend, you may need to sign and return your letter to reserve the financial aid package in case you decide to attend.
- Accept only what you need. A letter may offer only "yes" or "no" checkboxes for
 a total loan amount, but you don't need to accept the entire loan. Carefully read
 the Master Promissory Note (MPN) enclosed with the offer. You don't want to
 take on more debt than necessary, so if you can get by with less funding, accept
 only the amount you think you'll need.
- Stay in contact with the schools. If you are awarded additional scholarships
 or take on an additional job, notify the schools you're considering as soon as
 possible. Each school will need to reevaluate your need and its financial aid
 package. You should also notify the school if your situation has changed for the
 worse; if your parent lost a job, for example, you might qualify for more aid.
- Ask questions. Contact the financial aid office if you have any questions about the deadlines, direct or indirect costs of attendance, changes in your situation, or how to accept only part of a package. Financial aid officers can provide more information and help make sure you follow the process so you receive as much aid as possible.

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Four Year College Core

Many students at Treynor (approximately 80%) take what is known as the four year college core for admission. This consists of:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Social Studies
- 3 years of Science (Physical Science, Biology, and/or Chemistry and Physics)
- 3 years of Math (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II) (More highly technical college majors such as engineering need to take Advanced Math and Calculus)
- 2-3 years of Foreign Language
