SMARTER BALANCED ASSESSMENT... COM-ING IN 2017-18

As lowa prepares to switch our state assessment test next school year, I want to share information from the Iowa Department of Education website pertaining to Smarter Balanced Assessment. This article is just a short overview of the transition to SBA. Please visit the Iowa DE website at www.educateiow.gov for additional information.

lowa is on track to put in place a new state assessment in the 2017-18 school year that reflects our statewide standards in math and English language arts, provides better information about student academic growth, and fits with a broader goal of preparing all students for success.

In 2016-17, students will take the current state test while the lowa Department of Education prepares schools for the transition to the Smarter Balanced Assessments.

WHY THE TEST IS CHANGING?

Iowa has articulated a vision of preparing all students with the knowledge and skills they need for success beyond high school. A critical part of achieving that vision is having clear, consistent statewide standards that outline expectations for what students should know and be able to do. We must have a state assessment that measures how well students are progressing toward those expectations and reflects what is being taught in classrooms statewide. When Iowa transitions to the Smarter Balanced Assessments in the 2017-18 school year, the assessments will provide better information to lowa teachers and parents about how students are improving from year to year. This will help set the stage for improved student achievement.

AN IOWA PROCESS

A legislatively created lowa task force, charged with studying options for a new state assessment, recommended the Smarter Balanced Assessments in December 2014 after more than a year of extensive research.

Based on the task force's recommendation, the State Board of Education in November 2015 adopted state administrative rules implementing the Smarter Balanced Assessments, which students will take for the first time during the 2017-18 school vear.

HOW THE NEW ASSESSMENT WILL BE DIFFERENT

The Smarter Balanced Assessments build on Iowa's work to put in place consistent statewide standards for what students should know and be able to do in math and English language arts. Because the assessments are aligned to lowa's standards, they better reflect what is being taught in classrooms.

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SMARTER BALANCED ASSESSMENTS CONT'D. In addition to subject knowledge, the new assessments will measure complex, real-world skills such as critical thinking and problem solving. The assessments are online and computer adaptive. By adapting to each student, these assessments present an individually tailored set of questions to each student and can quickly identify which skills students have mastered. The assessments provide a more detailed picture of student learning by providing specific information on which skills students have mastered and where they need additional support. They also help ensure students are on track for the next grade and, eventually, college and the workforce. WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE 2016-17 SCHOOL YEAR Iowa students will take the current Iowa Assessments in math and English language arts while the Iowa Department of Education prepares schools for the transition to a new state assessment. Preparations will include professional learning for teachers and school administrators, ongoing outreach, and preparing schools to transition to an online/computer adaptive assessment format. WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE 2017-18 SCHOOL YEAR Iowa students will take the Smarter Balanced Assessments in grades three through eleven in math and English language arts. ABOUT THE SMARTER BALANCED ASSESSMENTS The Smarter Balanced Assessments were developed by a consortium of states, including lowa, guided by the belief that a high-quality assessment system aligned to rigorous academic standards will improve teaching and will help prepare students for success. **Treynor CSD Expands Health Office Staff** As student enrollment continues to increase, our district strives to expand course offerings, programs, services and staff to meet the needs of a growing student body. To meet the health needs of our students, the Treynor Board of Education took action this fall to expand our health office staff by adding a half-time school nurse at the MS/HS building. CASH FOR STUDENTS



The "Cash for Students" program has begun. Hy-Vee cash register receipts dated from September 1 through December 31, 2016 will be collected in the Elementary, Middle School and High School offices. Hy-Vee gives back \$1.00 for every \$200 spent in any of the fourteen Omaha and Council Bluffs locations up to a maximum of \$2,000. Over 403,000 in much needed funds has been donated to area schools as a result of this program.

All of our proceeds go to the Athletic Booster Club. Remember to save your receipts and turn them in to any of the school offices!

CAUTION: Changes in weather arriving soon...

As the weather begins to change, school cancellations and early dismissals can occur at anytime. If severe weather causes school to be cancelled prior to the start of the day, we will try to have information to the media by 6:30 a.m. In addition to our school website, the media outlets that will carry our announcements this year are: **KMA**, **WOWT**, **KMTV** and **KETV**.



If weather or unforeseen circumstances (loss of power or water) should occur during the day and school is dismissed early, <u>PLEASE HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE WITH</u> <u>YOUR CHILD.</u> When early dismissals occur during the day, we usually have limited time to get information out and many parents aren't aware that an early out has taken

place. Also, we have over 800 students in the district and only a couple of phone lines in each building. Don't assume that your child will be able to call you if a decision is made to dismiss school during the regular day. Have a plan in place! The elementary has forms for each parent to keep updated outlining your family's specific plan to deal with this type of situation. Parents of middle school and high school students need to discuss with their child what plan of action they will take in the event of an early dismissal during the school day. Proper planning now will provide assurance to you and your child that all will be okay should we ever have an unforeseen early dismissal.

Our student information database, JMC, will be used for all school notifications (voice, email, text). Please check your contact information to ensure it is up-to-date so you will receive these messages for school closings, late starts or early dismissals. Use the JMC Parent Access portal to check your contact information and make any additions or corrections as needed and to indicate how you want to receive notifications.


