"District Details"...a few notes from Superintendent Howell

Happy holidays to all of you from me – and the entire staff of the Treynor Community School District! This is the greatest school in which to work and learn - all because of you, our parents and community members, and our students. We love serving in this great school.



The holidays are happy, fun and exciting for all of us. Our kids love the break from school and a chance to see friends and relatives. There are always special foods, music and family traditions. With all the festivities during this busy holiday season, stress can become a factor, even for our kids. Here are a few tips appropriate for all of us to help them manage their stress.

- Discuss holiday plans in advance, and let kids participate in decisions. Kids need some degree of predictability. Prolonged uncertainty, constantly changing plans or last-minute decisions can all increase stress for our kids.
- If you're traveling, leave plenty of extra time and bring snacks, books, games and/or music. It's amazing how travel increases stress level of many kids, but with a little planning that time can actually be a de-stressor.
- Don't over schedule. You may not be able to do everything or see everyone.
 Kids can easily get "burned out," overtired and cranky during the holidays.
- Give kids some "down time." Don't expect them to be "on" all the time. Leave room for some quiet activities, like listening to music, taking a walk or reading a book – even their favorite video game.
- Make sure kids get plenty of sleep. While it may be exciting to stay up late, lack
 of sleep often leads to increased irritability. Yes, it's those two words structure
 and predictability. We as adults need it (and love it) and so do our kids. (They
 don't usually admit it! Ha!)
- Let kids be honest about their feelings. Don't force them to act happy and excited if they're feeling quiet or down.
- Don't promise things you can't produce. For example, don't promise a parent/ grandparent/favorite aunt will be home in time for the holidays if the decision is really out of your control. Surprises when they do arrive are so much more fun than disappointments when the "favorites" aren't able to join the festivities.
- Uphold and maintain family traditions. Kids count on certain traditions. They can
 have an important grounding effect by letting kids know that even though some
 things have changed, other things have remained the same. Watch that funny
 Christmas movie you have all seen "a million times," do the traditional toboggan
 run, or cozy up by the fire with the hot chocolate (and extra marshmallows).
- What most kids really want is your time, attention and reassurance. We are often surprised just how much our kids really want us, even more than all the toys and gifts. Sitting down with them to play that favorite board game, re-reading for the thousandth time that Christmas story, talking about their favorite music those are the things that will be what they remember in years to come.

CAUTION: Changes in weather arriving soon...

As the weather begins to change, school cancellations and early dismissals can occur at anytime. If severe weather causes school to be cancelled prior to the start of the day, we will try to have information to the media by 6:30 a.m. In addition to our school website, the media outlets that will carry our announcements this year are: KMA, WOWT, KMTV and KETV.



If weather or unforeseen circumstances (loss of power or water) should occur during the day and school is dismissed early, <u>PLEASE HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE WITH</u> <u>YOUR CHILD.</u> When early dismissals occur during the day, we usually have limited time to get information out and many parents aren't aware that an early out has taken place. Also, we have over 800 students in the district and only a couple of phone lines in each building. Don't assume that your child will be able to call you if a decision is made to dismiss school during the regular day.

The elementary has forms for each parent to keep updated outlining your family's specific plan to deal with this type of situation. Parents of middle school and high school students need to discuss with their child what plan of action they will take in the event of an early dismissal during the school day. Proper planning now will provide assurance to you and your child that all will be okay should we ever have an unforeseen early dismissal.

Our student information database, JMC, will be used for all school notifications (voice, email, text). Please check your contact information to ensure it is up-to-date so you will receive these messages for school closings, late starts or early dismissals. Use the JMC Parent Access portal to check your contact information and make any additions or corrections as needed and to indicate how you want to receive notifications.

Many high school students have volunteered for several activities over the past month.

- Almost 200 Special Olympic athletes and coaches from southwest Iowa, approximately 40 Treynor High School boys and girls basketball players, and about 20 cheerleaders joined forces for a unified Special Olympics event hosted by Treynor High School. This is the fourth year Treynor has hosted this event and participation continues to increase.
- The Wrestling Cheerleaders are hosting "Pump Up the Pantry" to help the local food pantry.
- The National Honor Society is collecting supplies for the Catholic Charities Domestic Violence Shelter in Council Bluffs from November 27—December 1. Supplies with the highest need are toilet paper, Clorox wipes, laundry detergent, shampoo, conditioner, plastic bags and paper towels. Other needs include diapers, baby wipes and facial tissues. Donations can be brought to the high school office.

The first semester tests will be held on Wednesday—December 20 and Thursday—December 21. We will run a bell schedule where classes meet for a longer class period. Class periods 1st through 5th will test on Wednesday—December 20 and 6th through 8th will test on Thursday—December 21.

When we return to school on Thursday, January 4th, we will be back to regular classes and all grades will still be part of the second 9 weeks (1st semester) until that grading period ends on Friday, January 12th.
