If a resolution to the situation cannot be reached, the matter should then be referred to the athletic director. If the situation still remains unresolved, the matter should be referred to the appropriate administrator. If the situation warrants further action, there are procedures and policies to guide the process.

The Treynor Community School recognizes the importance of maintaining the appropriate channels of communication. Following the above procedure allows for a more effective and efficient school district. The process ensures that concerns and issues are addressed as quickly as possible. CARDINAL MASCOT AGREEMENT



The Treynor Community School District recently made changes to the procedures it utilizes for the production of items that include the District's Cardinal mascot. The Board of Directors feels strongly that, while these changes result in additional requirements for local vendors who produce these items, the agreement that included these changes was in the best interests of the entire District community and ensured that the District could continue

using the Treynor Cardinal mascot that has been used for over forty years and has deep roots in the community.

These changes stem from an agreement the Board of Directors, in consultation with the District's Legal counsel, reached with Iowa State University. The agreement requires the District to use only vendors licensed by Iowa State who operate consistent with the agreement reached between the licensed vendors and Iowa State to produce apparel and other items that include the District's Cardinal mascot.

The District appreciates all the vendors that take the time to produce high-quality apparel and other spirit items for our staff, students, and community. We look forward to continuing to work with these vendors to share the Treynor Cardinal Spirit throughout our community.

NEW BOARD MEMBERS TAKE OATH

Three new <u>board members</u> took the oath of office on November 19, 2019 during the regular board meeting. The regular meeting was first conducted and included an official reading of thanks given to outgoing board members Amy Graber, Heidi Guttau-Fox and Sally Myers. Amy Graber served a total of 4 years, Heidi Guttau-Fox served for 3 years, and Sally Myers has served 8+ years on the board. New board members taking the oath of office are Keith Christensen, B.J. Dreyer and Stephen Winchell.

Brandon Vorthmann was elected President and Mickey Stogdill was elected Vice President. Assignments of duties include Keith Christensen, Curriculum; BJ Dreyer, Board Policy Review; and Stephen Winchell, Labor Management. Brandon Vorthmann will continue his Facilities assignment while Mickey Stogdill will continue his Finance assignment.

CAUTION: CHANGES IN WEATHER ARRIVING SOON ...



As the weather begins to change, school cancellations and early dismissals can occur at anytime. If severe weather causes school to be cancelled prior to the start of the day, we will try to have information to the media by 6:30 a.m. In addition to our school website, the media outlets that will carry our announcements this year are: **KMA, WOWT, KMTV and KETV**.

If weather or unforeseen circumstances (loss of power or water) should occur during the day and school is dismissed early, **PLEASE HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE WITH YOUR CHILD.** When early dismissals occur during the day, we usually have limited time to get information out and many parents aren't aware that an early out has taken place. Also, we have over 800 students in the district and only a couple of phone lines in each building. Don't assume that your child will be able to call you if a decision is made to dismiss school during the regular day. Have a plan in place! The elementary has forms for each parent to keep updated outlining your family's specific plan to deal with this type of situation. Parents of middle school and high school students need to discuss with their child what plan of action they will take in the event of an early dismissal during the school day. Proper planning now will provide assurance to you and your child that all will be okay should we ever have an unforeseen early dismissal.

Our student information database, JMC, will be used for all school notifications (voice, email, text). Please check your contact information to ensure it is up-to-date so you will receive these messages for school closings, late starts or early dismissals. Use the JMC Parent Access portal to check your contact information and make any additions or corrections as needed and to indicate how you want to receive notifications.

The Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) replaced the former Iowa Assessments, with students taking the new tests for the first time in spring 2019. Iowa Testing Programs at the University of Iowa oversaw the test's development and administration. English la guage arts and math tests were given to students in grades 3 through 11, while science tests we given in grades 5, 8, 10. The ISASP was developed to specifically align to the Iowa Core and better reflect what is being taught in Iowa classrooms and how students are progressing toward grade-level expectations.

BAND UNIFORM FUND DRIVE

To the Community of Treynor and Alumni of Treynor Community Schools, The Treynor Community School District and Treynor Music Boosters are proud to announce the start of the Cardinal Band Uniform Fund Drive, with the purpose of raising money for new band uniforms for the 2020-2021 school year.



Over the past three decades, the Treynor High School band has grown to be recognized as one of the top musical performing groups in the state of Iowa. Through the years, the dedicated students of the program

have amassed over 80 Division I ratings at state music festivals in the combined areas of concert, marching and jazz band. The jazz band has placed first at the Iowa Jazz Championships four times, and the marching band has received numerous awards at the Southwest Iowa Band Jamboree and the Loess Hills Fieldfest. In addition, they have earned 29 consecutive Division 1 ratings at state contest. The cornerstone of our program, the concert band, is considered one of the best ensembles in the area.

Our current uniforms, which were purchased in 2008, are beginning to show their wear. And, due to increasing enrollment in the band program, we do not have enough uniforms for each member to wear. The students and music boosters are hard at work fundraising for this project, but with a cost of over \$40,000 for 100 uniforms, your help is needed.

On the attached form, you will see a cost breakdown for each uniform part. You can donate money for any or all of the uniform parts that you wish. Those patrons who donate the cost of an entire uniform will, with their consent, have their names engraved on a plaque that will be on display in the music department awards case.
