FREE MEAL PROGRAM EXTENDED



Due to an extension of a nationwide waiver granted to the USDA, local school districts may now provide FREE breakfast and lunch to students until the end of the 2020-2021 school year. The Treynor School District has chosen to participate in the program, and it is available for ALL students. All students will be able to eat breakfast and lunch at no charge.

However, if your child chooses to bring a cold lunch and wants to have milk with their lunch, they will still need to pay for the milk. The same applies for students who purchase a la carte items or doubles. Please make sure there are funds in your meal account to cover these extra charges. Also, if your family had a negative balance prior to the start of the free school meal program, you are responsible to pay for all charges.

Online students and students who have to quarantine: Meals are also available at no charge to all online and quarantined students. These meals are available to pick-up at the school. Please notify Jen Brammer at the Superintendent's Office (jbrammer@treynorcardinals.org or 712-487-3414) if you plan to participate in the meal program.

CAUTION: CHANGES IN WEATHER



As the weather begins to change, school cancellations and early dismissals can occur at anytime. If severe weather causes school to be cancelled prior to the start of the day, we will try to have information to the media by 6:30 a.m. In addition to our school website, the media outlets that will carry our announcements this year are: **KMA, WOWT, KMTV and KETV.**

If weather or unforeseen circumstances (loss of power or water) should occur during the day and school is dismissed early, **PLEASE HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE WITH YOUR CHILD.** When early dismissals occur during the day, we usually have limited time to get information out and many parents aren't aware that an early out has taken place. Also, we have over 800 students in the district and only a couple of phone lines in each building. Don't assume that your child will be able to call you if a decision is made to dismiss school during the regular day. Have a plan in place! The elementary has forms for each parent to keep updated outlining your family's specific plan to deal with this type of situation. Parents of middle school and high school students need to discuss with their child what plan of action they will take in the event of an early dismissal during the school day. Proper planning now will provide assurance to you and your child that all will be okay should we ever have an unforeseen early dismissal.

Our student information database, JMC, will be used for all school notifications (voice, email, text). Please check your contact information to ensure it is up-to-date so you will receive these messages for school closings, late starts or early dismissals. Use the JMC Parent Access portal to check your contact information and make any additions or corrections as needed and to indicate how you want to receive notifications.

- School starts at 8:20am. Please drop off your child(ren) from 8am to 8:15am each morning.
- Please continue to monitor your child(ren's) health and keep him or her home if they are ill. If you have any questions, contact the school nurse.
- Please send your child(ren) to school with a coat, hat and mittens. We go outside for recess on most days (even when it is cold).
- Please make sure to read the weekly District Announcements for information regarding student health, school activities and district updates.

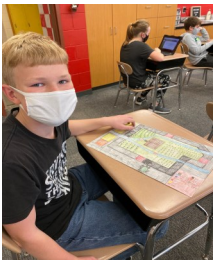


NOTES FROM THE MIDDLE SCHOOL BUILDING



As we transition from Fall to Winter, our students continue to do great things. The district feels it is important to give back to our community. One way we try to instill this in our youth is to provide various volunteer opportunities. Some of the activities they have participated in during November and December are listed below.

- The students helped decorate fifty-four trees that were delivered to Primrose Retirement Community in Council Bluffs the day after Thanksgiving.
- The Middle School Card Pride students and staff collected items for our "Random Act of Cardinal Kindness - Thanksgiving Meal." The groups were asked to bring in corn, green beans, soup, french fried onions, sweet potatoes, jello, stuffing, au gratin potatoes, fruit, roasting pans, cake or brownie mix, and iced tea as well as money to be used for a gift card to purchase a ham. We provided fourteen meals to families in need within our community.
- The middle school students and staff took part in Giving Tuesday this year! We collected items for the MICA House homeless shelter and delivered the items following our drive.
- The Middle School Leadership students are currently organizing a card drive. Our middle school students will write thank you notes to healthcare workers in Council Bluffs who are at the front lines helping with Covid-19. They plan to deliver these notes to hospitals in Council Bluffs before the holidays.
- During the month of November, the Middle School Student Council helped promote an act of kindness. They worked closely with our local Treynor Food Bank to collect donated items for several families in need during this holiday season. Each Middle School Card Pride group, as well as the Middle School Student Council and Teachers, were responsible for collecting the items needed for a holiday dinner. In all they helped create 14 holiday dinners!



Besides volunteer activities taking place within the middle school, we want to highlight a few fun academic activities that have taken place over the last month in the middle school.

Sixth Grade students have been applying their knowledge of Mesopotamian City-States to design their own historically accurate planned city in Ancient History Class.

Seventh and Eighth Grade students participated in an Escape Room to discover more about Veterans Day. They had to solve puzzles and clues to learn about the history and purpose for celebrating Veterans Day. It took a couple days but everyone had success and "escaped" in addition to gathering knowledge about the National Holiday.

Seventh and Eighth Grade students have been working on character descriptions from A Christmas Carol. We are setting the mood of Christmas with a fireplace and Christmas lights!

As the first semester draws to a close, I want to bring your attention to some things that have been, or will be, happening in the high school recently. The school year, though not free of challenges for anyone, has been going well and the staff and students have been making the year a great success.

Activities: As the winter months move along, we are able to watch, even if it is partially virtually, our students excel in extracurricular activities.

- Large Group Speech contests are just around the corner.
- The debate team has started competitions recently.
- The high school Christmas concert is Thursday, September 17.
- Basketball and Wrestling are now in full swing.
- Winter Color Guard, Cheer, and Dance are all putting on great shows.



Academics: As the first semester comes to an end, let's reflect on a few opportunities Trey High School students have had the opportunity to participate in.

- Students in American History and Government classes got to learn about the voting process and were able to walk through the registration process.
- Students in Human Biology made and labeled models of the human heart and are in the midst of dissecting cats.
- One of the Industrial Technology classes is designing and building a shelving unit for the Family and Consumer Science classroom.
- Career Readiness students have been attending on site and virtual job shadows.
- Over 300 students are working out each day in physical education classes.
- Spanish 1 and 2 classes are reading novels.
- Math classes are piloting new curriculum in order to implement for next school year.

Semester tests: Semester tests this year will be on Friday, December 18th and Monday, December 21st. We will run a regular bell schedule both days. Odd class periods will test on Friday and even class periods will test on Monday.



OUR MATH DEPARTMENTS ARE PILOTING!

Our math teachers are excited for the opportunity to pilot and explore new curriculum that has been vetted and rated as high performing through edreports.org. All K-12 math teachers will pilot one unit from Envisions and Illustrative Mathematics during the 2nd semester as part of our [District Curriculum Review Process](#). Below are the summaries edreports.org provided for each curriculum.



Envisions

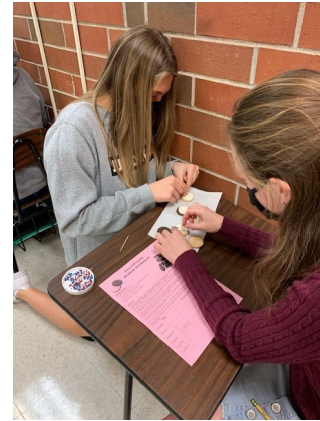
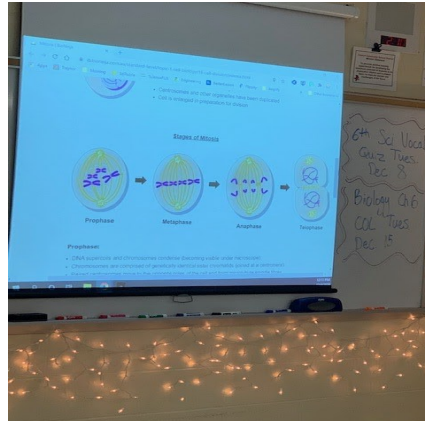
PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES (PLCs) AT THE ELEMENTARY

Each grade level PLC has created SMART goals designed to increase student achievement and drive teacher collaboration. Below is the focus for each grade level.

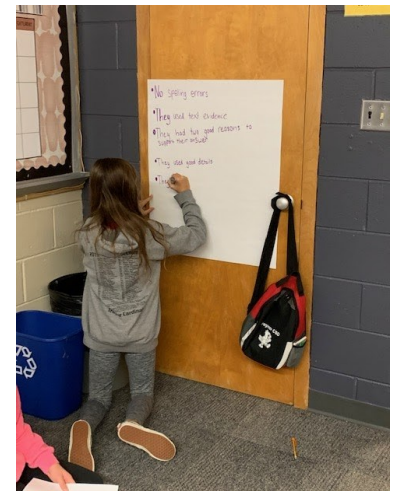
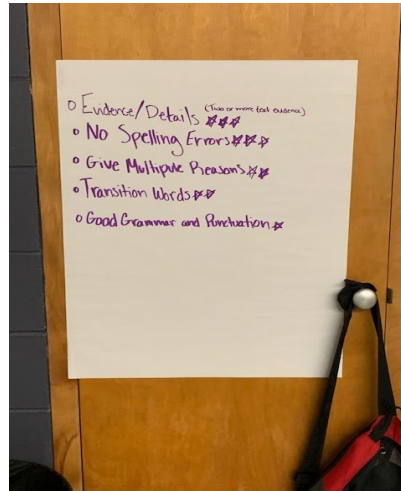
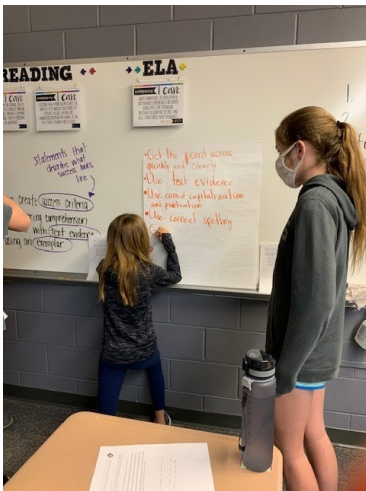
- Kindergarten: Upper and lowercase letter recognition Aa-Zz and number recognition 0-20.
- 1st Grade: Sight word fluency and math facts fluency
- 2nd Grade: Identifying gaps in learning due to COVID and creating plans to address those gaps. Fact fluency is one of those areas identified.
- 3rd Grade: Using text evidence to support answers and multiplication fluency
- 4th Grade: Fluently multiplying and dividing within 100 and correctly using homophones and homonyms.
- 5th Grade: Simplifying fraction and finding the main idea of a nonfiction text.



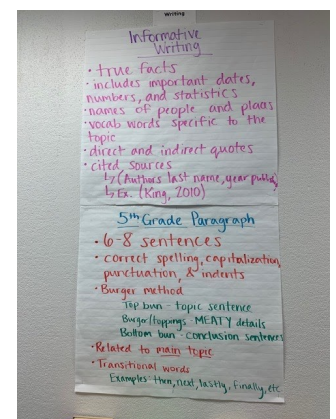
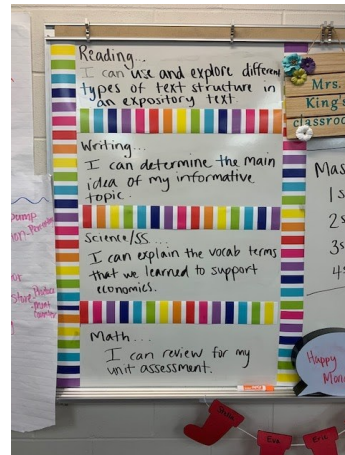
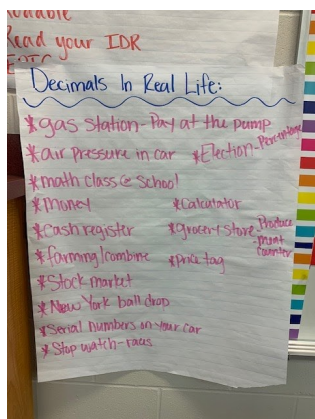
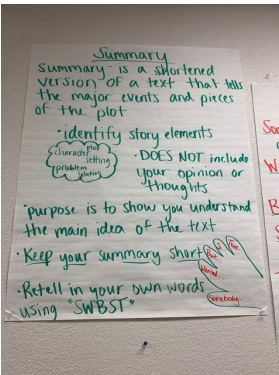
Students use cookies and sprinkles to simulate the stages of mitosis.

It is the policy of the Treynor Community School District not to discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, disability, age (for employment), sexual orientation, gender identity, creed, marital status (for programs), or socio-economic status (for programs) in its educational program and its employment practices, pursuant to Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act, and other applicable state and federal laws.
