

CAUTION: Changes in weather arriving soon...

As the weather begins to change, school cancellations and early dismissals can occur at anytime. If severe weather causes school to be cancelled prior to the start of the day, we will try to have information to the media by 6:30 a.m. In addition to our school website, the media outlets that will carry our announcements this year are: **KMA**, **WOWT**, **KMTV** and **KETV**.



If weather or unforeseen circumstances (loss of power or water) should occur during the day and school is dismissed early, PLEASE HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE WITH
YOUR CHILD. When early dismissals occur during the day, we usually have limited time to get information out and many parents aren't aware that an early out has taken place. Also, we have over 800 students in the district and only a couple of phone lines in each building. Don't assume that your child will be able to call you if a decision is made to dismiss school during the regular day. Have a plan in place! The elementary has forms for each parent to keep updated outlining your family's specific plan to deal with this type of situation. Parents of middle school and high school students need to discuss with their child what plan of action they will take in the event of an early dismissal during the school day. Proper planning now will provide assurance to you and your child that all will be okay should we ever have an unforeseen early dismissal.

Our student information database, JMC, will be used for all school notifications (voice, email, text). Please check your contact information to ensure it is up-to-date so you will receive these messages for school closings, late starts or early dismissals. Use the JMC Parent Access portal to check your contact information and make any additions or corrections as needed and to indicate how you want to receive notifications.

This year is off to a very fast start. I can't believe that we are finishing up the first quarter and that November is just around the corner. Our students have not only been very busy academically, but they have also spent time participating in various other educational activities.

As you may or may not know, October is National Anti-Drug Awareness Month. In conjunction with antidrug awareness, each year our student council members organize for "Red Ribbon Week," which this year is from October 23 - October 27. During this week, our students and staff dress up in various ways to bring more attention to the fight against drugs. The various days dress attire consists of the following; Monday - "Turn Your Back on Drugs" (Clothes Backward Day), Tuesday - "Give Drugs the Boot" (Western Wear Day), Wednesday - "Fight Against Drugs" (Camo Day), Thursday - "Wild About Drug Free" (Wild Hair Day), Friday -"Don't Get Tied Down with Drugs" (Tie-Dye Day).

Jon is a Guinness Book of World Records Breaker and besides showing us his strength, he also shared some of his life experiences around bullying, deep insecurities and loneliness. Today, Jon stands confidently in front of crowds sharing the widespread issues of bullying, poor self-image and overcoming personal obstacles.

Finally, I would like to inform our parents that on Thursday, Oct. 26, the middle and high school will have a brief assembly with our students to share our new lockdown strategy called A.L.I.C.E. Our intent is to follow with phase one the next week, where all teachers will discuss evacuation/barricade plans with their students and at some point that first week in November, we plan to have our first drill using A.L.I.C.E. options.


