# SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICE DELIVERY PLAN

This past fall, a committee comprised of parents, special education teachers, general education teachers, administrators and AEA representatives met to draft the district's Special Education Service Delivery Plan. The Iowa Department of Education requires all districts to submit a plan every five years. This plan must outline how services are organized and provided to eligible individuals, how caseloads of special education teachers are determined and regularly monitored, and the procedures for resolving caseload concerns. The completed plan will be submitted to the state in June of this year.

The Special Education Service Delivery Plan was developed in accordance with Iowa Administrative Code rule 41.408(2) "c". The plan will be presented to the School Board in June of 2020 for approval. Once board approval has been obtained, the plan will be shared with district personnel and the public through the District's website and through special education meetings.

# **OPEN ENROLLMENT DEADLINE**

Parents/guardians considering the use of the open enrollment option to enroll their child/children in another public school district in the state of Iowa should be aware of the following dates:

**March 1, 2020:** the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2020-2021 school year, except for "good cause" reasons or kindergarten applications.

Kindergarten applications must be filed on or before September 1 of the school year in which open enrollment is requested. (September 1, 2020 for the 2020-2021 school year).

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### **RADON TESTING**



GOOD NEWS: This school year, the Treynor Community School District tested its elementary building for radon. We recently received good news! Our test results came back well below the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) advised radon action level of 4.0 pCi/L. This means we now have peace of mind that our students, teachers, and staff are learning and working in spaces that are as safe as possible from radon.

To learn how to accurately do the initial radon testing ourselves, we saved taxpayer dollars by receiving training from the School Radon Training & Support System facilitated by Energy Association of Iowa Schools (EAIS). If we would have found elevated radon in our school, EAIS would have coached us through the process of fixing it. EAIS also helped us proactively place our other school buildings on a multi-year rotating radon test schedule so we can continue to ensure radon safety in the future.

On February 10th, the High School Jazz Choir participated in their State Contest and received an I rating. Their application to Iowa Vocal Jazz Championships is in process, and they will find out soon if they are one of the 8 choirs selected in Class 2A to compete. You can see them perform at the Reiver Jazz Festival on Thursday, March 12th, or hear them at the Pops Concert in Treynor later that evening.

The jazz bands have also had strong showings at their performance. The High School Jazz Band received a division 1 rating at contest and also placed first in Class 2A at the district level. 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The Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) testing is just around the corner. Students in grades 3-11 will be testing the week of March 30, 2020. Below is some important information in regards to the upcoming assessments.



#### Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) Overview of the Assessment

- 1. The Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) is aligned with the Iowa Core standards, providing a clear and accurate assessment of student learning outcomes.
  - —The assessments are developed for the state of Iowa and align with the grade-specific Iowa Core standards.
  - —The assessments were developed in collaboration with Iowa educators.
  - —The assessments will be administered March 30-April 3 in the following subjects and grade levels:
    - -Math: Grades 3-11
    - -English Language Arts, including reading and writing Grades 3-11
    - -Science: Grades 5, 8, and 10
- The assessments will provide parents with actionable information about their child's learning.
  - —The results will provide a detailed analysis of how students performed relevant to the proficiency definitions set on the Iowa Core standards.
  - —Over time, parents will also be able to access year-over-year analysis of how their child performed from one year to the next.
- **Designated Supports:** As part of the ISASP testing system, each child has access to certain designated supports if requested by the student, parent, or educator. Decisions on supports should reflect those that the student requires and uses during instruction and for assessments. Review the list of designated supports and identify those that your student currently receives in the classroom and you believe to be especially important for his/her success. Please email Dr. Mark Hopkins with requested support and rationale for the need.     - —**Answer Masking:** The student is able to block off answer choices.
    - —Color Contrast: The student is able to adjust the text color and screen background color based on the student's needs.
    - **—General Masking:** The student is able to block off content that is not of immediate need or that may be distracting. Masking allows students to hide and reveal individual answer options, as well as all navigational buttons and menus. The student is able to focus his/her attention on a specific part of a test item by masking.
    - —Text to Speech/Audio Support/Spoken Audio: The student uses this feature to hear prerecorded or generated audio of tasks.
    - —Turn Off of Universal Features: This feature allows disabling any universal feature that might

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- **—Zoom (test-level):** The test platform is pre-set to be enlarged for the student before the test begins.
- **—Bilingual Dictionary:** A bilingual language word-to-word dictionary is provided to the student as language support.
- —**Magnification Device:** The student adjusts the size of specific areas of the screen (e.g., text, formulas, tables, and graphics) with an assistive technology device. Magnification allows increasing the size to a zoom universal feature.
- —**Native Language Translation of Directions:** Translation of general test directions (not item prompts or questions) is language support available to students prior to starting the actual test. Test directions can be provided either by being read aloud or signed by a test administrator who is fluent in the language. Translations by a human or the test platform.
- —**Separate Setting:** Test location is altered so that student is tested in a setting different from that available for most students.
- —**Student Reads Test Aloud:** The student reads the test content aloud. This feature must be administered in a one-on-one test setting.

All requests for designated supports must include the student's name, grade level, the rationale for requested support, and be submitted to mhopkins@treynorcardinals.org by March 13, 2020.


