Minutes

The Board of Directors of the Treynor Community School District met in regular session on Monday, August 10, 2020, 6:30 p.m., in the HS/MS Library, located in Middle School Building, 102 E. Main St., Treynor, IA 51575.

Call to Order & Roll Call

President Vorthmann called the regular meeting to order at 6:30 p.m., and roll was taken. The following board members were present: President Vorthmann, Vice President Stogdill, Mr. Christensen, and Mr. Dreyer. Mr. Winchell was absent.

Amend and/or Approve Agenda

A motion was made by Dreyer, seconded by Stogdill, to approve the agenda. Motion carried 4-0.

No visitors to the meeting chose to address the Board of Directors.

Reports and Communication Items

Elementary Principal

Ms. Kay, Elementary Principal, reported: On Monday, August 17, 2020, kindergarten teachers will host a "Meet and Greet" for parents and students to come to the school to get to know their teacher. The following safety protocols will be taken: 1) Maximum of 3 families per teacher/per signup time; 2) Masks are expected to be warn until social distancing can safely occur in classrooms; 3) Attendance is limited to parents and the incoming kindergartener only.

Mrs. Berens, Middle School Principal, reported: Sixth Grade Virtual Orientation will occur Friday, August 14th. This will be a 30-minute virtual session, with students divided into six groups to allow for a more interactive presentation. Students and their parents will also be given the opportunity to sign up for a time to come to the school on Monday, August 17th for a self-guided tour.

Mr. Hedger, High School Principal, reported: Incoming freshmen were provided a virtual orientation that included a Google Slide Presentation created by Mrs. Floerchinger, school counselor, and a video with short greetings from teachers who primarily have freshmen students. It also included a short greeting to the parents of freshmen students.

Mr. Navara, Activities Director, reported: 1) Summer sports went well. The coaches and athletes followed the safety protocols and we're very proud of the baseball team advancing to the state tournament. 2) Fall sport practices have begun with smaller group skills instruction. The athletic associations have provided guidance for safety protocols. 3) Final decisions are being made with respect to spectator admission for fall sports.

Discussion/Information/Review Items

Return to Learn Plans Update

Board members were provided the most recent guidance from the Iowa Department of Education and the Iowa Department of Public Health on Reopening Iowa's Schools Safely and Responsibly, including when to consider moving to one of the alternate Return-to-Learn Plans (Hybrid Plan or Online Plan). The board also received documentation on the paid leave requirements of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRAA).

Student Handbooks for 2020-2021

Building principals reviewed student handbooks for the 2020-2021 school year. The handbooks will include a Face Covering/Mask paragraph:

The safety and well-being of students is always the District's highest priority. To this end, it is the District's expectation that all students wear an appropriate face covering/mask throughout the school day. The District reached this conclusion based upon objective information and by relying upon local, state, and federal guidelines. The District will provide appropriate face coverings/masks to any students who do not have access to an appropriate face covering/mask. If any student has a medical condition that may affect their ability to wear a face covering/mask, they should contact their building principal. Any student who refuses to comply with this safety requirement may be subject to discipline.

The MS/HS Student Handbook will also include information about Senior Release.

Review Graduation Requirements (Policy 505.6)

Board members and administrators reviewed and discussed Board Policy 505.6 Graduation Requirements. Past discussions have been to increase the number of credits necessary to graduate, but no action has been taken to date. Board consensus was the desire to increase credits from the current 44 credits, after studying possible additions. One directive from the board was clear: any additional requirements must be made with purpose.

Teacher Back-to-School Schedule

Superintendent Hopkins shared the Teacher Back-to-School Schedule. New teachers were in the building beginning August 7th. Earlier today, August 10th, new teachers met with their mentors and began working together. All teachers will be back in the buildings beginning Tuesday, August 11th. In addition to the normal back-to-school items, the extra professional development days prior to students returning on August 19th will be used to familiarize everyone with the new safety requirements due to COVID and to prepare for the possibility of moving to an alternative instruction plan (Hybrid or Online) if the need arises.

Review Title IX Policy Updates

U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos took historic action in May 2020 to strength Title IX protections for survivors of sexual misconduct and to restore due process in campus proceedings to ensure all students can pursue an education free from sex discrimination. For the first time ever, the Department's Title IX regulations define sexual harassment, including sexual assault, as unlawful sex discrimination. The new Title IX regulation holds schools accountable for failure to respond equitably and promptly to sexual misconduct incidents and ensures a more reliable adjudication process that is fair to all students. The new regulation comes after years of wide-ranging research, careful deliberation, and critical input from survivors, advocates, falsely accused students, school administrators, Title IX coordinators, and the American people, including over 124,000 public comments.

Policy updates will need to be completed with assistance from the school attorney. In the near future administrators and board members will receive training on Title IX issues and procedures.

Construction Update

Kevin Strehle, BCDM architect, provided a written construction update.

Work Complete:

- · All upper concrete risers are complete in the new auditorium.
- · Excavation complete for lower auditorium area.
- · Painting existing auditorium was completed last week.
- · New weight room painting is complete.
- · Most of the fire sprinkler pipe in the existing school is close to 95% complete.
- · Framing is essentially complete in addition area.

Short-term look ahead for future activities:

- · Flooring scheduled to be installed in weight room area the week of August 10th.
- · Primer and 1st coat on walls will start shortly in the classroom area.
- · Vestibule aluminum is on schedule to start within a week.
- · EIFS contractor is starting on exterior EIFS. Exterior concrete stoops will be completed in the next 2 weeks with more exterior concrete to follow as the EIFS contractor moves around the building.
- · Grading and site work for the addition area is scheduled to start this month.

The project remains on schedule.
